## REQUIREMENT FOR DOCUMENTS TO SUPPORT CLAIM FOR AMERICAN OPPORTUNITIES CREDIT (AOC)

**Background:** The NTTC has been asked if Tax-Aide volunteers can allow a claim for AOC based solely on verbal information provided by the taxpayer.

**NLT RESPONSE:** The taxpayer must provide a Form 1098-T from the college or university. The reasons are:

- 1. The institution is required to complete a form 1098-T for each enrolled student, with a few exceptions listed in the instructions.
- 2. The form provides more information than just the tuition paid. It provides scholarship information, it confirms the enrollment status of a student as at least 1/2 time and defines a graduate student, all of which have an effect on the eligibility and value of the AOC credit.
- 3. In addition, the form identifies adjustments for prior years, which, if present, render the return out-of-scope.

It should not be difficult for the student or the taxpayer to get a copy if it has been lost or never received, since many schools make them available electronically.

Another concern is the possibility of a fraudulent return, particularly if the taxpayer is unknown to the site volunteers. This can be a significant credit as you know and can be very tempting.

All that said, if there are extenuating circumstances **and** the preparer knows the taxpayer from prior years, exceptions could be made with LC approval and proper "due diligence".
